Gloucestershire College is working with Gloucester Works and local employers to improve your employability.

This course is fully funded by the European Social Fund (ESF). It has been developed to reflect the skills and attributes required and this training will give you an insight into elements of the Plastering industry.

Introduction in to Plastering

This programme includes the introduction to the tools, materials, backgrounds, preparation and procedures needed to plaster a section of wall.

You will learn how to check and prepare a background before plastering, how to mix different plasters, how to set out a wall, fix angle beads and float using plumb and dot or broad screed.

You will learn how to use a range of plastering tools such as brick trowel, finishing trowel, gauging trowel, hawk/hand board, float mechanical mixer and a range of materials such as aggregate (soft sand and grit sand), hydrated lime, cement, perlite/browning plaster, angle beads, scrim cloths.

You will gain taster knowledge of the construction sector to enable you to make the transition into further learning and work related training.
